Heidelberg Catechism Questions 56, 31, 32

Christians, what do you believe?

Jesus Among the Doctors

What is eternity?

Children are full of questions, wonderful questions, unanswerable questions. Jesus, too.

And where better to ask questions than in the Temple where the learned doctors were found, elders who had spent their entire lives in the study of the holy Jewish Law. Jesus was as curious as any bright twelve-year-old child. So when the family made the annual pilgrimage to Jerusalem, he went to the Temple where he astonished the teachers with his questions, and also with his answers. And there, at last, his frantic parents found him....

Jesus was an eager questioner, alert, ready to learn. He didn't notice time passing, or realize that his parents might be worried.

Already he was about his Father's business.

And that business, he was to learn, was not the law expounded in the Temple. That business was not law—but love.
