REFLECTION

What Is The Need?

In Manilla, orphans often fend for themselves in the streets. Our ministry there provides them food, first aid, shelter, education and the good news of Christ. Not long ago, the workers noticed a strange pattern; young girls, generally 10 to 13 years old, were disappearing. As the workers checked further, they discovered the girls were being abducted into brothels. They turned to police for help; later, they found out that some of the police themselves were operating the brothels. (continued from reverse) On the streets where you live, if you are like most American citizens, children are not forced into prostitution, elderly women are not tortured, nor are 13-year olds beaten and shot by soldiers for scrawling graffiti on a wall. But in the streets, the fields and the jails beyond our borders, the realities are different —and often hard to face. We don't want to believe what is before us. "Surely," we think, "these must be extraordinarily evil and isolated incidents."

Unfortunately, though incredibly evil, they are far too commonplace. In a recent survey of over 65 overseas ministries representing tens of thousands of overseas Christian workers, at least three-quarters said they had witnessed police and political corruption and abuse of power. One in three reported child prostitution, abusive child labor, the murder of street children as well as other atrocities toward the defenseless and innocent.

Yet despite extensive exposure to such suffering, missionaries, Christian doctors, and relief workers generally can do very little to bring justice to the victims. As guests in a foreign country, they are vulnerable to retaliation. They have neither the investigative nor the legal expertise to document the abuse they encounter, much less to seek help or justice.

To simply report the abuse can be a dangerous, difficult task. Too often, local authorities cannot be relied on for relief, or trusted to protect the witness. There is no specialized ministry for overseas Christian workers to turn to when people in their communities suffer oppression—no agency of fellow Christians with the experience, expertise and resources to whom they can entrust their concerns.

The abuses these workers witness surely remain burned into their hearts and souls. So they must in ours. With such difficult issues and overwhelming numbers, this is a problem so great that it may seem all one can do is turn away, avoid the issue, deal with it by not dealing with it. Until now.
