Confession of Faith

Westminster Confession of Faith, I.1 (1647)

Although the light of nature and the works of creation and providence do so far manifest the goodness, wisdom, and power of God, as to leave men unexcusable; yet are they not sufficient to give that knowledge of God and of His will, which is necessary unto salvation. Therefore it pleased the Lord, at sundry times, and in divers manners, to reveal Himself, and to declare that His will unto His Church; and afterwards, for the better preserving and propagating of the truth, and for the more sure establishment and comfort of the Church against the corruption of the flesh, and the malice of Satan and of the world, to commit the same wholly unto writing: which maketh the Holy Scripture to be most necessary; those former ways of God's revealing His will unto His people being now ceased.

REFLECTION

Three Things at Once

We understand the concept of “office:” we have just elected leaders to office. The word comes from the Latin *officium*, meaning duty or service.

The idea that Christ’s work of redemption on our behalf can be understood as his filling the three Old Testament offices of prophet, priest, and king, goes back to the 4th century A.D.... At the time of the Reformation, was picked up by John Calvin. Ever since then, it has been an important element in the way Reformed Christians understand what Christ came into the world to do.

The New Testament teaches that the Old Testament points to Christ.... Want to know why Jesus came teaching and preaching? Then Study what an OT prophet does. Want to know why Jesus came to die? Study what a priest does. Want to know why Jesus came proclaiming that in his arrival the Kingdom of God had broken in on the world? Study what an OT king does. Each office shows an aspect of what Christ, the eternal Son, came to do for us: a prophet speaks the infallible truth of God in a world of counterfeits, lies, half-truths and ignorance.

We need a faithful prophet, because without an authoritative word from Above we are left with mere opinions about what life means. We need a sympathetic priest because without one, our real moral guilt exposes us to the law of the universe: divine retribution. And we need a good king because without the might and power of someone looking after us, our enemies—Sin, Death, and the Devil—would ruin us. But thanks be to God—Christ is all three of these to us: Prophet, Priest, and King!

Today, ponder the Westminster Shorter Catechism, and give thanks that God has not been a silent onlooker to the plight of the world, lost in its confusions:

Q. 24 How does Christ execute the office of a prophet?

A. Christ executes the office of a prophet, in revealing to us, by his Word and Spirit, the will of God for our salvation.
